FIELD PLAYABILITY POLICY

These are the deciding factors by which ball fields are deemed to be **UNACCEPTABLE FOR PLAY / PLAY NOT PERMITTED:**

- 1. Standing water is on the infield.
- 2. Three-quarters (3/4) of the ball field is damp where you sink in a quarter inch (1/4 inch).
- 3. A field is too slick and too muddy prohibiting traction.
- 4. Water is ponding in the outfield and wet to the point that foot traction could be compromised.
- 5. Ground / soil conditions are wet around home plate, pitching rubber, 1st, 2nd, 3rd base and causing slick conditions so that traction may be compromised, or field may be damaged.

USE OF FIELD DRYING AGENTS:

WCPRD will make decisions regarding the use and application of field-drying agents or chemicals to dry ball fields based on availability of product in department inventory, field staffing, weather forecast, and time frame.

SPECIAL NOTE:

- WCPRD will not provide drying agents for non-league tournaments and sport-related functions. These materials will need to be purchased (\$12.00/bag or current price) by the event coordinator 5 10 days prior to the event date and can be stored onsite. Storage location must be coordinated with the park manager.
- At all times, drying agents will be applied by trained <u>WCPRD staff only</u>— no exceptions.
